3. AC Report:

- Please don't touch smoke detectors.

- Inspections of apartments for smoke detectors and termites

6. Officers' Questions and reports to management (General Officer and Board)

- Rose Rep: Has the custodial staff changed? Answer: They are rotated every 6 months
- Sepulveda B: laundry room laundry door room doesn't lock
- President note: Don't wait until the meeting to let Regis know about maintenance. Work orders can be submitted through Maximo any time.
- Sepulveda A: playground light is flickering and the neighbor has put in a request and has been more than a month ago.
- Sawtelle D: playing children between the building and plants and its very dangerous.
- President note: due to administrative oversight the Resident Handbook contains rules that conflict with those in the rules and regulations. The Handbook is being rewritten. Please refer to UAS Rules & Regs for rules.
- The current rule is that children under 13 must be supervised, which seems high. President will follow up with housing regarding the age of supervised children and other rules and regulations. In particular, if the age will be decreased from 13 years old.
- Sepulveda B:
 - o study lounge the toilet was clogged.
 - Some of the gates slam really loudly (ie. 3171 Sepulveda)
- Sawtelle A: who to call for maintenance request. It's a routine request send it through Maximo or call maintenance during office hours (7:30 am to 4 pm). Outside those hours the AC team will pick up this is only for emergencies.

7. Updates on current issues

- Compost Bins- The Athens compost bins have been installed. Be careful and aware of children not playing by the garages since the Athens trucks will be coming through there. Each of the green compost bins have have signs with pictures to help residents determine the items that should go into the bin.
 - Perhaps buying a roll of biodegradable starch bags to provide to residents for proper composting as part of the education process

- <u>Safety & Security</u> gates on Sepulveda have been fixed to prevent easy access from outside. New brighter lights will be installed as a test and if approved will be implemented throughout the rest of the community
 - Tree trimming is a city issue and ResLife will follow up with the city.
- <u>Crosswalk</u> During the walkthrough of the property with Barbara Wilson, director in Housing the cross walk on Sepulveda poses a big hazard. Adding lighting on the ground may be extremely beneficial, because the current system of lights are in a blind spot. Barbara Wilson following up with UCLA Transportation.
- <u>Dog Potty Areas</u>- President, Housing and rRsLife conducted a walkthrough and a few areas have been identified. Sawtelle A and lots of space on far side Sawtelle. Sepulveda has 4-5 areas. Realistic timeline- summer. Areas have to be ADA compliant and also not disturb residents.
- <u>Study rooms</u>- apartment spaces will remain on line until better spaces are done. Lighting and WIFI is being upgraded. Don't use the restroom in the study room if they're not using the study spaces. New location: plans have been presented- waiting for final. Housing is now looking into constructing a new building. Looking at property lines to see if space at south Sawtelle by the parking structure can be used for something like study room.
- Rent increases have been confirmed and will be 3% for students and 7% for faculty
- Graduate contracts for affordability.
